CORDILLERA INTERNATIONAL FILM FESTIVAL AWARDS 2021 OFFICIAL SELECTIONS

Over 150 filmmakers, Grand & Special Jury members and celebrity guests gathered in Reno-Tahoe to celebrate the best in film and award over 100K in prizes to emerging filmmakers.

RENO, Nev. (August 2, 2021)— Cordillera, in partnership with Bill Pearce Motors, featured 150 Official Selections, chosen from a field of 2000 submissions received from 83 countries. Cordillera's Grand Jury of revered and expert voices came together to participate in interactive panels and award feature-length and short films shown at CIFF 2021 with prizes valued at \$100,000, giving filmmakers the chance to have their films seen by industry icons and emerging innovators.

In addition to celebrating completed films, Cordillera also strives to support emerging voices and offers PITCHFEST!, a competition where filmmakers pitch their ideas to a panel of industry icons, in front of a live audience, for a chance to win a 100K production package that includes a \$60K Panavision Production Package Grant, 12K production consultation - presented by the Film Nevada Initiative with consultation with Australian Cinematographer, Peter Menzies Jr.(Die Hard with a Vengeance, A Time to Kill, Shooter), a 25K Entertainment Attorney Package and \$3.5K - Executive Producer Fee from Upside Entertainment, LLC.(1917, Human Condition). Ten individuals were selected out of over 100 submissions. The winner of CIFF 2021 PITCHFEST! is Life Unworthy by filmmaker, actress and writer, Eileen Grubba.

"The level of talent that shared their work with us this year was humbling," shared Emily Skyle-Golden, executive director of Cordillera. "The messages behind so many of the stories we shared were powerful, inspiring and impactful. I think we were all so ready to come together and experience the thrill of witnessing the reactions of a live audience."



This year featured highly-acclaimed films that were previously screened at leading worldwide festivals including Berlin, SXSW, Toronto, and Tribeca. The Opening/Centerpiece/Closing of the Festival includes "Women is Losers," "Not Going Quietly," and "Peace By Chocolate". Out of the 12 feature-length films carefully selected this year, an impressive 83% adhere to CIFF's Focus on Inclusion, giving a voice to the underrepresented in front of and behind the camera, including indigenous, female, BIPOC, LGBTQ, and the disability communities. 42% of features this year are by first time directors, or making their narrative feature debut.

The 2021 Cordillera International Film Festival attracted a record number of film submissions from more than 80 countries and showcased 150+ official selections throughout the 5-day festival, which brought together filmmakers and audiences to celebrate the power of storytelling through film.
